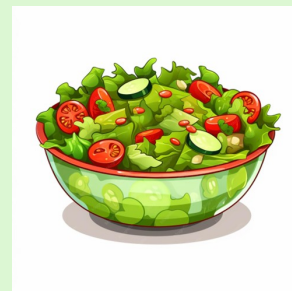

**The Most Foolish ‘Thing’ I Ever Did in My Life. So Far.....**

About 10 years ago in early fall, while at home, dinner in the oven, two daughters at home and after putting around all day, putting summer ‘stuff’ away for the winter, I had one more thing to do – bring a small fan down to our basement – which we called the Catacombs for a good reason! As I always was and still am if warm enough, I was barefoot and in shorts, savoring the last beautiful early fall evenings. As I went into the second room of the catacombs and bent over to place the fan on the floor, to my horror, I saw, what I was convinced, were a young boy’s legs, which I viewed only up to mid-thigh, since there was so much junk in the basement. I called out asking who was there. No response. I felt strongly that it was a kid...with pretty long & skinny legs... but WHY doesn’t answer was a mystery. I said, don’t worry, I’m not going to do anything to harm you, I just want to help you. No Response again. So I turned and ran up the staircase and locked the door. It gets worse; one of the officers was Bill Regan’s – Village Administrator at that time – brother. And a good friend of ours was a Yonkers PD Detective at the time. So I was cooked before sunset. So word was out quite quickly about my ‘scary experience’. Not by me! By the way, the Police couldn’t have been nicer. I would have been happier if they had just sent ONE officer in ONE car, but at least I saw our taxes at work! And I really DID have an eye doctor’s appointment the next day....skinny legs? What??

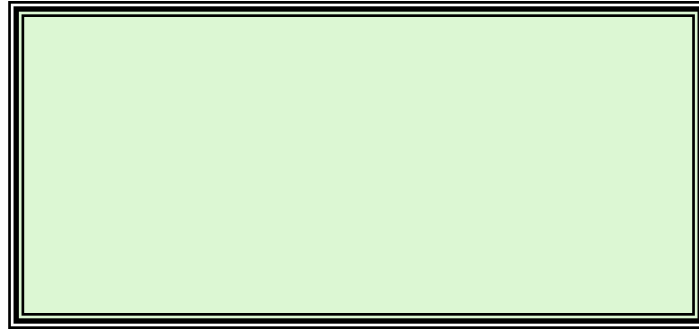
